Take Loop 101 north to the Peoria Avenue exit. Turn left onto Peoria Avenue. The clinic is on the left side of Peoria just before 99th Avenue.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds. Mixed breed dogs that have been listed with AKC Canine Partners may participate provided their listing number has been recorded on the entry form.

Mixed breed dogs entered in these events must list the breed name as "mixed breed" and not as a breed hybrid and must include their AKC Canine Partners number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Bitches in season, aggressive, blind or deaf dogs or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance are ineligible to participate.

Awards

First through Fourth place rosettes will be awarded in each class for each height division for qualifying scores. Qualifying ribbons will also be awarded to all dogs receiving qualifying scores. Double Q ribbons, beautiful MACH poles and MACH ribbons will also be awarded to those who earn them. We will use NCR sheets.

The club will also be awarding rosettes for **new titles**.

All awards must be collected during the show. None will be held over or mailed. Awards will not be available until judges have reviewed the appropriate scribe sheets.

Exhibitors have the option of entering EITHER the Preferred classes OR the Regular classes. Exhibitors may not mix Preferred and Regular classes at any set of trials.

Fifteen and Send Time (FAST) class

This agility titling class is meant to be an additional test of strategy, skill, accuracy and speed with timing and distance handling. It demonstrates a dog's athletic ability and willingness to work with its handler in a fast-paced atmosphere over a variety of agility obstacles.

The Fifteen and Send time class uses fifteen (15) point valued obstacles and/or obstacle combinations. The course will include a "Send Bonus" with distance challenge that will award a bonus of twenty (20) points if completed successfully. Teams must successfully complete the Send Bonus to achieve a qualifying score, as well as a minimum number of required points defined at each class level.

Level	Minimum score to Qualify	Distance for Send Bonus
Novice	50 points	5-10 feet
Open	55 points	10-15 feet
Excellent	60 points	15-20 feet

The handler picks the order in which the obstacles are taken (there are no wrong course penalties). Team will use the following Standard Course times (SCT) to accumulate points, attempt a Send Bonus and to reach the finish line. Each second over the SCT is a one point penalty.

Regular	SCT	Preferred	SCT
8"	38 seconds	4"	41 seconds
12"/16"	35 seconds	8"/12"	38 seconds
20"/24"/26"	32 seconds	16"/20"	35 seconds

The FAST class is not part of the Master Agility Championship titling program.

OBSTACLES

Obstacles will conform to current requirements of the Agility Rules and Regulations. Some of the contact equipment has a rubberized-coated surface in accordance with AKC specifications. Weave poles will have 24" spacing. Electronic timing will be used in all rings.

Height Divisions

The following jump height divisions shall be used in all Titling trial classes:

- 8 inches** For dogs 11 inches and under at the withers
- 12 inches** For dogs 14 inches and under at the withers
- 16 inches** For dogs 18 inches and under at the withers
- 20 inches** For dogs 22 inches and under at the withers
- 24 inches** For dogs over 22 inches at the withers
- 26 inches** Dogs may be entered at this height at their owner's discretion

The following jump height divisions shall be used in all Preferred Titling trial classes:

- 4 inches** For dogs 11 inches and under at the withers
- 8 inches** For dogs 14 inches and under at the withers
- 12 inches** For dogs 18 inches and under at the withers
- 16 inches** For dogs 22 inches and under at the withers
- 20 inches** For dogs over 22 inches at the withers

Height Card Regulations....NEW JANUARY 1, 2010

All dogs competing in agility must possess an official AKC Jump Height Card. An official AKC Jump Height Card is defined as either a permanent jump height card, a valid temporary jump height form, copies of two different measuring forms (placing the dog in the same height class) dated on or after the dog's second birthday, or copies of three different measuring forms (two of which place the dog in the same height class) dated on or after the dog's second birthday.

At 2 years of age two measurements are required. If these two measurements put the dog in two different jump heights, then a third measurement will be used to determine the dog's official jump height. The handler will retain all yellow forms until the second (or third) measurement is taken and the permanent jump height card is received from AKC. No permanent height card will be issued until the second (or third) measurement is officially recorded, with the exception of dogs measuring over 22 inches whose owner may request the issuance of a permanent height card with one measurement. The owner's request to issue a permanent card for a dog that measures over 22 inches after one measurement will negate the option of any additional measurements for that dog's permanent jump height card. To receive the card after one measurement, the owner must sign and check the appropriate box on the Agility Measurement Form acknowledging the request to issue a permanent jump height card for dogs over 22 inches. In making this decision, it still allows for the owner to request that the dog be re-measured by using the Challenge Measurement Process in the future.

For dogs between 15 months and two years of age, one measurement is required. The handler will retain the yellow measurement form. This form is the dog's **temporary jump height card form**; no card will be issued by the AKC. A card will not be issued until the dog's permanent measurement is recorded. This temporary jump height card form expires on the dog's second birthday. Dogs that do not have a valid Jump Height Card must be measured by a judge of record for that trial and will only be effective for that set of trials, excluding the dogs jumping in the 24-inch or 26-inch height division. If an AKC Field Representative or a Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) is present, all dogs that have not been issued a permanent Jump Height Card or temporary jump height (yellow) form must be measured for a Jump Height Card regardless of the jump height entered. If a dog is measured by an AKC

Field Representative or Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) and is now eligible to jump in a lower height class, the measurement is effective immediately for any future runs. This does not apply to a challenge measurement for a permanent jump height card. Prior to the second birthday, a dog may have one additional measurement after the initial official measuring. The measuring official shall be informed that the re-measurement is a "challenge" measurement and the box on the form shall be checked off. Misrepresentation of a dog, including altering information on a Jump Height Card, is grounds for misconduct. Exhibitors should carry the original valid official Jump Height Card at each trial to present upon request.

If there is not an AKC Field Representative or Volunteer Measuring Official in attendance, all dogs that have not been issued a permanent Jump Height Card or temporary jump height (yellow) form may still compete; however, they must be measured by a judge of record for the trial, prior to running at each trial. The judge's measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running. After the age of two, each dog is allowed a one-time request to make use of the challenge measurement process over its lifetime. This challenge measurement process consists of a minimum of two (2) challenge measurements. If both challenge measurements place the dog into the same jump height class and it is lower than the dog's current jump height class, then AKC will issue a new permanent card. If only one of the two challenge measurements places the dog in a lower jump height class, then a third challenge measurement is required to determine the dog's jump height class. If the dog's jump height class does not change, a new jump height card will not be issued. Until such time that the dog has received all required challenge measurements and the owner has the re-issued permanent jump height card in-hand, the dog must continue to compete at the "original" jump height.

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk their course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. The walk-through allows handlers to plan their strategy for running the course. A walk-through period will be held prior to each class.

There will be no course familiarization for novice handlers at this trial

A warm-up area, consisting of one regulation agility jump, shall be provided for all exhibitors. Exhibitors may **NOT** use the warm-up area to relieve their dogs.

Ring Information

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. This trial will be held in 2 rings at least 100 feet by 100 feet in diameter. All rings will run simultaneously. Exhibitors **should be prepared to have walked more than one course**. Exhibitors with potential conflicts **must** inform the gate steward **BEFORE** the class starts. Excellent will walk by jump height to the extent possible. Except in EXTRAORDINARY circumstances, there will be no additional walk-throughs. A conflict is viewed as when either the handler has to be in another ring/event with the same or a different one of "their" dogs or the dog has to be in another ring/event. It is the **gate steward's discretion** where the dog will be placed in the running order. Wanting to see someone else run another one of your dogs in a different event does not constitute a conflict. The clubs hosting the trial and the Trial Secretary have no obligation or responsibility for providing service, runners or public address systems for the purpose of locating or calling dogs that are not brought to the ringside when required.

This trial will be held outside on grass, regardless of weather. There is limited shade available.

Exhibitor Information

The trial will be conducted under American Kennel Club **Regulations for Agility Trials**. For copies of the Regulations, write to The American Kennel Club, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Raleigh, NC 27617-3390 or call (919) 233-9767 or can be printed directly from the Internet - <http://www.akc.org/agregs.htm>.

Entries must reach the Trial Secretary by 6 PM MT, March 21, 2012. Fees must accompany entries. Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate and legible information on their entry forms. Entry fees are non-refundable except for bitches coming into season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund up to 75% of total entry fee paid. A returned check will invalidate an entry and a \$40 service fee will be charged.

It is the responsibility of the owner or his/her agent to enter the appropriate class. The trial secretary will not automatically change entries to conform to AKC rules. Dogs may not move between regular and preferred classes once the trial has closed.

Move ups to a higher class will occur from Friday to Saturday, Saturday to Sunday, and Sunday to Monday. A move-up book will be at the show site on Friday at the ribbon table. The request must be made to the Trial Secretary no later than half hour after the close of each day. **No pre-show move-ups after 6 pm April 2, 2012. Unless you are a Novice A moving to Novice B please contact show Secretary at least 30 minutes before the start of the trial.**

The judging will start at 9 am on Friday and 8 am other days. During the hours of judging owners are to be on call and have their dogs ready to bring into the judging ring promptly in order that the judging will not be delayed. Dogs need only be present for the judging of their class. Dogs not needed for further judging may be excused.

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. **Any exhibitor entering this trial acknowledges that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all of the obstacles safely.**

Exhibitors are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. There will be no refund of entry fee for exhibitors that are asked to leave the show site because of their dog or children creating unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engaging in unsafe behavior. The Superstition Kennel Club and the Scottsdale Dog Fanciers Association may decline any entry for cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness or other causes, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the Kennel Club or any official thereof.

No glass containers are allowed on the property.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free from internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Arizona law requires rabies vaccine every 3 years.

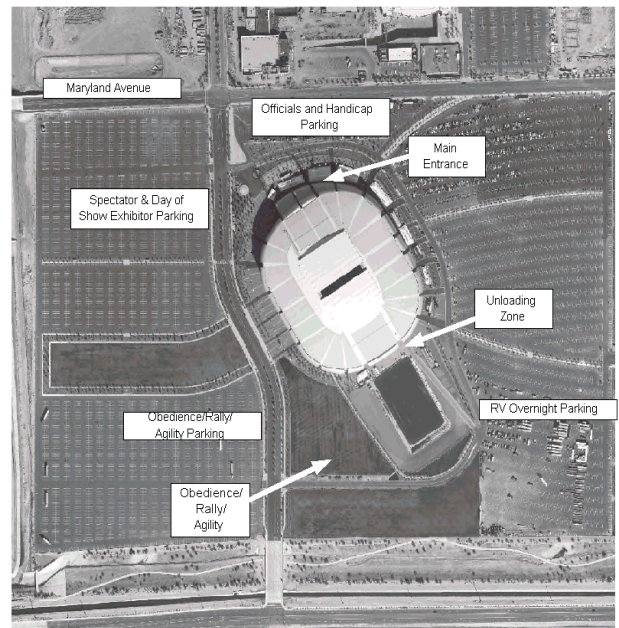

INSTRUCTIONS

Handlers may opt to enter in a higher height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an **Agility Jump Height Card** may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or *back-to-back trials* only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

Dogs listed in the **AKC Canine Partners** SM program may be eligible to enter all-breed AKC agility trials at the club's option. These dogs should be listed as All American Dog and must include their AKC number on the entry form and check the AKC No. box.

Junior Handlers should enter their Junior Handler number on the front of this form. Should you not have your Junior Handler number, it may be obtained from the American Kennel Club (919) 233-9767. If the Junior Handler is not the owner of the dog identified on the face of this form, what is the relationship of the Junior Handler to the Owner? _____
