Move ups before the trial are limited to Novice A to Novice B, Novice to Advanced and Advanced to Excellent. Move ups from Excellent to Masters are NOT allowed since they are in 2 different trials.

Tentative schedule: Saturday - Novice AM, Master to follow (time based on number of novice entries), Detective at the end of the day. Sunday - Novice AM, Advanced to follow, then Excellent. Detective is at the end of the day, time will be set based on entries.

DOG ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word “dog” is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind are able to participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can compete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

No entries will be accepted by phone, email, or fax, and **NO HAND DELIVERIES please.** Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary’s address. Inquiries may be directed to Renee Stanneart at agility_pups@cox.net. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each invalid check.

Refunds. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open

or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. *However, the club reserves the right to alter this policy due to current events. If the trial is cancelled due to public health guidelines, you will receive a full refund.*

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are eligible for a 75% refund. The health and safety of your dog and all other dogs entered at the trial should be seriously respected.

If the pulled entry is due to suspected dog or human of having a contagious illness, full refund will be issued. Please let the trial secretary know as soon as you can.

WAIT LIST INFORMATION

JCACGP is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 25 entries will be placed on the club's wait list on order of receipt. **All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary by the listed closing date.** No entries may be withdrawn for a refund after this date (except for BIS). If a withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait list entry, a full refund will be issued for the withdrawn entry IF done prior to Friday, February 11th at 6pm. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial will receive a full refund.

Last day for any changes in the waitlist is Friday, February 11th at 6pm.

SEARCH AREA & RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class. Searches may be indoors, on matted, carpeted, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces. Trial will take place rain or shine.

Search area sizes will be as stated in the AKC regulations for all elements and levels.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up and waiting areas.

The **Handler's Briefing** will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class*, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing. ***This may be modified per AKC Best Practices. Please see "Notice to Exhibitors" section for more information.**

One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers in the warm up area if they choose.

SITE INFORMATION

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date, this includes driving into the parking lot or otherwise disturbing their regular business. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future. This trial site will not be used for Scent training one week before the trial.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state “No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area”.

Spectator Area. Spectators are usually encouraged; and are limited to exterior spaces only at this trial. Exhibitors are forbidden to discuss any details of the searches with handlers who have not run!

Crating space Please crate your dogs in your car. Please keep dogs quiet, if barking cannot be controlled you will be asked to leave. Keep dogs on leash while not working. **No RV or oversized vehicles will be able to park onsite.** No setups will be allowed. There will be no overnight security.

Exhibitors are responsible for **cleaning up after their dog(s).** Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place.....	Blue
Second Place.....	Red
Third Place.....	Yellow
Fourth Place.....	White
Qualifying Score.....	Dark Green

A New Title rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. You may pick up titling ribbons immediately upon completion. All other placement ribbons – more information will be included in your trial information.

High in Trial – Offered for all levels

All level High in Trial rosettes will be offered at this trial. Only teams who participate in the same difficulty level in *all* elements offered (Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried), and qualify in each are eligible to win High in Trial. There is no separate High In Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections; they are combined. The High in Trial is determined by adding the team’s faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team’s times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win. Teams winning High In Trial will earn a rosette.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

A **preliminary confirmation** will be sent once your entry is received. A final confirmation with trial details will be sent out about a week before the trial.

In attempt to follow **CDC guidelines**, we will be following these guidelines to keep the trial safe for everyone. **Masks or face coverings must be worn during interior searches and are highly encouraged any time you**

are away from your vehicle. Social distancing of six feet will be in place. These requirements are in place regardless of vaccination status. **If there is a change in these guidelines, a notice will be included in the trial information letter sent out prior to the trial.**

Handler Briefings – you will receive links to videos of your search areas the night before the trial. The judge will also give each exhibitor a short briefing when you come to each search area (no general briefing, and no class briefing before class starts).

Small groups of exhibitors will arrive at a specified time and you will stage from your car. You will run your dog through several searches back to back before returning to your vehicle. Once you are done running all your classes, you will be required to leave for the next group to arrive. **You must wait in your personal vehicle anytime you are not showing or pottyng your dog.** Every effort will be made to keep your multi-level dogs as close together as possible. If you have multiple dogs in the same level, you will run them within the same group. More information will be included in the trial information letter sent to all exhibitors prior to the trial.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The venue is a tobacco and alcohol-free facility & grounds. Please refrain from smoking or vaping while on the property.

The **safety of the dog** is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. **It is expressly understood** that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Jumping Chollas Agility Club of Greater Phoenix (“the club”) and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the club or any official thereof.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian’s recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge (tags ok). Dogs are permitted to have a wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog’s harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches where allowed). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed. Handlers will have the option to run Detective class off-leash.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through

a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Details about flow and run order progression will be covered in the briefing.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

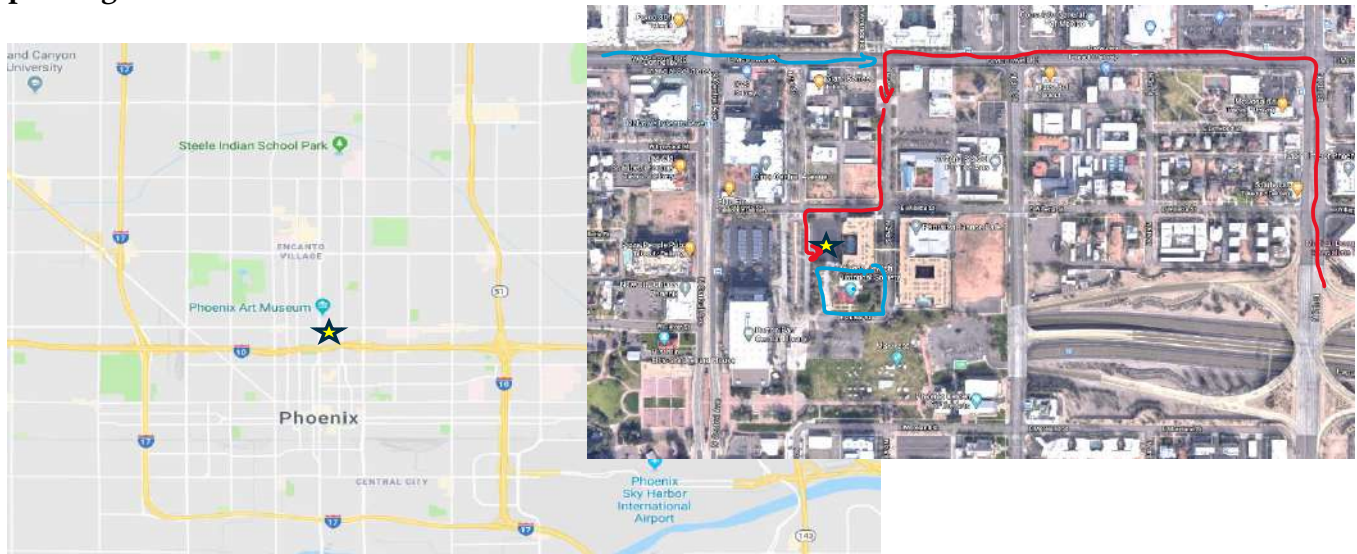
